


#### **2023 Annual Survey Summary**



- The annual survey was added to the Online Filing System to pop-up upon successful submission of 2023 Annual Recertification.
- 2263 CCPs started the survey.
- For **Question 1**, when asked if they consent and would like to take the survey, 89.17% (2018 CCPs) agreed and took the survey.
- In this version of the survey, we employed 3 logic-based questions. They are called out on each slide. A "Yes" answer to the previous question would allow them to answer the next. Whereas a "No" answer would skip the next question, as it would not apply to them.




### Question 2: What is your age? cross-sectional analysis

CCPs with a <u>Bachelor's Degree</u> 1006 responded.


CCPs with a <u>Master's or Doctorate Degree</u> 805 responded.


Year runs across the bottom. The number on top of each column represents the number of CCPs who responded with that year.


### Question 3: When do you plan to retire? cross-sectional analysis





### Question 4. Has your team hired a recent graduate? (Graduated within one year)












#### Question 6\*: Do you perform pediatric cases?



# Question 7\*: Would you hire a new graduate for your pediatric program?



# Question 8: What do you think the minimum education requirement should be for an entry level perfusionist?






#### Question 8: What do you think the minimum education requirement should be for an entry level perfusionist? cross-sectional analysis




How CCPs who's perfusion training was obtained with a **Bachelor's Degree**




How CCPs who's perfusion training was obtained with a Post-Baccalaureate Certificate







#### Question 10: What is the Perfusion Program Name(s)?






















### Question 17: 3-year review of the option that best describes your primary employer.






